Quality Improvements

Palliative Care: Our team is committed to enhancing the consistency of our palliative care services by conducting comprehensive interdisciplinary

assessments of holistic needs for each resident. We aim to ensure these assessments are completed upon admission and whenever significant changes occur. Sharing the assessment results with family members facilitates discussions on how our team can best assist and ensure the residents' needs are met with compassion and understanding.

Support Groups: Our Support Groups offer families facing similar concerns an opportunity for socialization and mutual support. These groups provide a supportive environment for developing networks and coping strategies.

Fall Prevention: With a focus on resident safety, our goal is to reduce the incidence of falls and minimize associated injuries. Utilizing tools such as the Fracture Risk Score, we adopt a proactive approach to identify high-risk individuals and tailor care accordingly. By implementing preventive measures, we strive to create a safer environment for all residents.

Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion: We are dedicated to fostering a respectful and inclusive workplace for our diverse team members. To achieve this, we aim to increase the number of staff members completing equity, diversity, and inclusion education upon hiring and annually thereafter. By enhancing understanding and awareness, we aim to bridge any gaps and promote a culture of respect and acceptance.

Education: to ensure the highest quality of care, our staff members will undergo training in Gentle Persuasive Approaches (GPA). This training equips them with practical strategies for confidently addressing behaviors associated with dementia. The training modules include an Introduction to Personhood, Brain and Behavior, The Interpersonal Environment, and Gentle Persuasive Techniques for Respectful Self-Protection, both individually and in teams. At Villa Colombo Vaughan, we are committed to providing compassionate care and creating a supportive environment for our residents and staff alike.

Resident Satisfaction: We are committed to continuously improving our services based on feedback. While 89.4% of residents highly agree that our team listens to their needs well, our goal is to raise this percentage to 92%. Ensuring residents feel heard and respected is paramount to their care and well-being.

Safety Measures

To prioritize the safety of our residents, staff, and visitors, we collaborate with York Region Public Health and UniversalCare to implement rigorous safety protocols. Visitors are required to sign in at the front desk for contact tracing purposes. We also encourage the use of masks, hand sanitization, and adherence to COVID-19 symptom guidelines.

Best Practice for Infection Control Measures

If you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19, we kindly ask that you refrain from visiting until symptoms subside. Additional precautions include wearing a well-fitted mask in public settings, avoiding non-essential activities where mask removal is necessary, and refraining from visiting high-risk individuals or settings until fully recovered.
